Founded by two families of children born deaf, the Decibels Foundation supports programs for families with children with hearing loss. Our goals are (I) to ensure that essential programs for this population are fully funded, and (2) to guarantee that educational and technological choices are not limited by cost, availability, or prejudice. To date, we have primarily supported programs aimed toward early childhood (0-3 years). Decibels now seeks to expand its mission to ensure that support for this population continues as children transition into elementary school. Specifically, we aim to inform Massachusetts public school educators about the unique learning issues faced by all children with hearing loss, and to support educators in helping these students to meet their full potential.
